Funding Options to Support Your Graduate Education

Below is helpful information provided to help navigate graduate education funding opportunities.

1. File the FAFSA.

We recommend that all applicants complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on an annual basis. Information from the FAFSA will determine your eligibility for need-based aid. The University will review each admitted graduate student application and post an Estimated Financial Aid Notice, which can be accessed through Student Business on Wolverine Access. Please visit the Office of Financial Aid website at finaid.umich.edu for more information.

2. Investigate external funding opportunities.

In addition to School of Nursing and Office of Financial Aid funding opportunities, external sources of funding may be available. Please reference the enclosed scholarship list. Some health care systems offer tuition benefits to staff, depending on their policies. Please refer to the direct supervisor, nurse manager, and/or Human Resources Department at your place of employment for additional information.

3. Supplemental School of Nursing funding

Scholarship funds administered through the School of Nursing are intended to supplement other University-level resources, and may be awarded based on a variety of factors, including donor-directed criteria, merit, or merit paired with demonstrated financial need. Scholarship funds do not require repayment, and may be awarded for one or more years. Admitted graduate applicants are automatically included in the eligible pool of candidates for School of Nursing funding. There is not a separate application to be considered for this type of funding. Supplemental funding is administered through the School of Nursing Financial aid department, please contact the department directly for additional information: umsn-scholarships@med.umich.edu.

4. Update your “My Scholarship Profile”.

If you are offered admission and pay your Enrollment Deposit, Wolverine Access has a feature called My Scholarship Profile. You can submit information about yourself to be used in identifying your eligibility for certain University of Michigan and School of Nursing scholarships.

5. Consider the Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP).

Students that are planning for a future career as a nurse faculty member should consider taking part in the Nurse Faculty Loan Program (NFLP). The NFLP is a direct loan program with a cancellation provision for recipients of the loan. Section 846A of the Public Health Service Act authorizes the lending school to cancel up to 85% of the NFLP loan, for borrowers who serve as full-time nurse faculty members for a consecutive four-year period at a school of nursing following graduation from the program.
